

The following weigh scale procedures will be in effect as of March 1, 2009. All North Grenville residents will be asked to weigh their vehicles on the scale when entering and leaving the Waste Transfer Depot. The following fees and exemptions will be applied.

1. A fee shall be charged at a rate of \$120 per tonne with a minimum fee of \$10.00.
2. **The fee shown shall not apply to the following:**
 - Waste oil
 - Paint
 - Brush and branches
 - Type II Garbage includes but not limited to: aluminum food or beverage cans, aluminum foil, glass bottles, recyclable paper, newsprint, and all other material which is being collected by the Municipality for recycling
 - Type III Garbage includes but not limited to: boxboard and paperboard, cardboard, fine paper, magazines and all other such materials recycled by the Municipality
 - Type IV Garbage includes but is not limited to grass cuttings, garden refuse, leaves and all other material which is generally accepted to be compostable waste.
 - Type I Garbage that is in a container for garbage with the applicable bag tag attached. This includes but is not limited to: kitchen and vegetable waste, animal waste, clothing and other articles which would normally accumulate at a residential dwelling including renovation material/waste transported to the Waste Transfer Depot by the home owner or contractor
3. ¹Should the weigh scale become inoperable, volume and weights will be estimated and the Municipality shall apply the Transfer Station Rates outlined in Schedule B of the revised By-law 10-09.
4. The fee for Freon removal shall be \$30.00 per item in addition to the applicable rate.
5. The following rates shall apply to tires:

Tire Sizes	Without Rims	With Rims
Car and truck less than 20" in diameter	\$4.00	\$10.00
Heavy truck 20" – 24" in diameter	\$15.00	\$20.00
Tractor/utility tires over 24" in diameter	\$20.00	\$30.00

6. Only domestic demolition and construction waste will be accepted. The Director of Public Works reserves the right to limit quantities.
