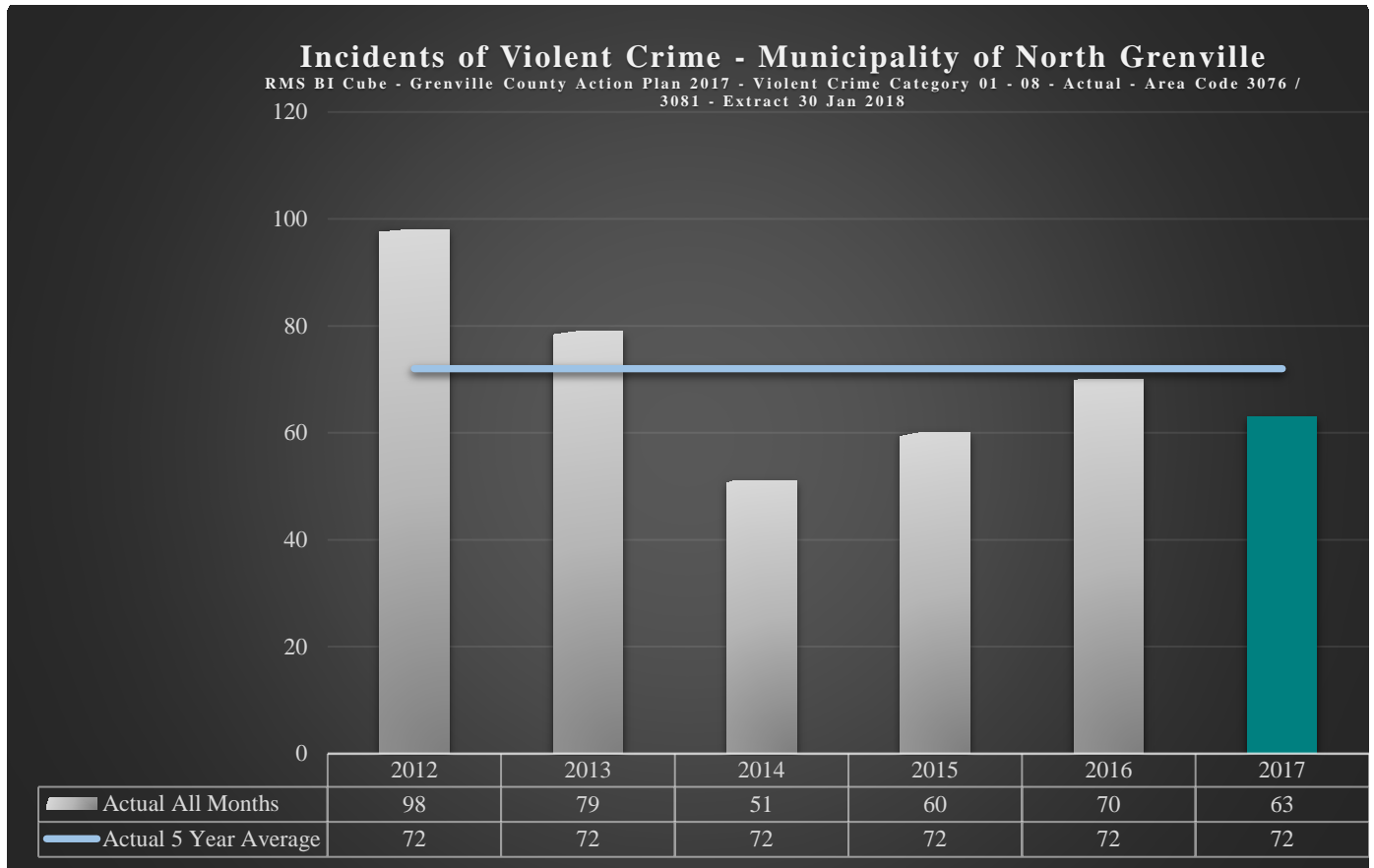

Violent Crime:

As in the last 5 years, there were no incidents of Homicide (attempted or actual) in 2017. This category includes the most prevalent forms of violent crime in the Municipality; Assaults, Sexual Assaults and other crimes against persons (See included table 2.1 from 2017-2019 Action Plan).

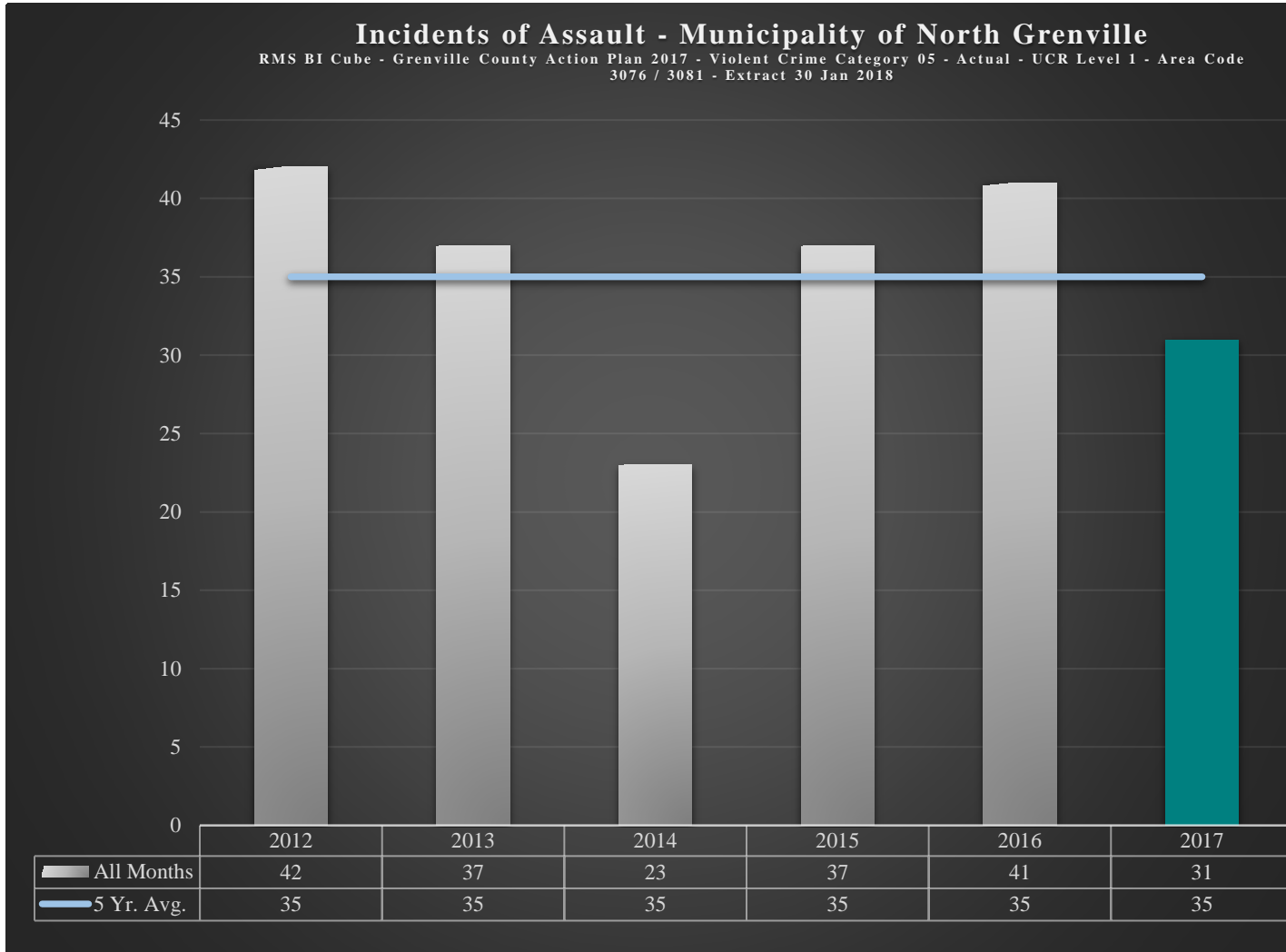


The goal laid out in the 2017-2019 Action Plan is to reduce violent crime by 2% by 2019. 2017 saw a reduction of -10.5% in violent crime of amount in 2016, this amounts to a -13.3% compared to the 5 year average.

03 Import / Export – Heroin, Import / Export – Cocaine, Import / Export – Other CDSA Sec.6 Import.
