



Municipality of North Grenville Transportation Master Plan Notice of Public Information Centre

The Study

The Municipality of North Grenville has initiated the development of a Transportation Master Plan (TMP) and Commuter Cycling Plan (CCP). Together the two plans will establish the Municipality's strategic direction to meet development needs and shifting trends related to the transportation network for the 2031 horizon year and beyond. As one of the fastest growing municipalities in Eastern Ontario, North Grenville is committed to providing a broad range of amenities and services to its residents and visitors that will accommodate future mobility needs.

The TMP will examine existing issues and identify opportunities in North Grenville's transportation network, as well as alternative solutions. The CCP will identify gaps in the cycling network and select routes that may facilitate a complete and integrated cycling network. Recommendations arising from the studies will guide future transportation initiatives and infrastructure improvement priorities for all modes of transportation.

The TMP will be undertaken in accordance with the requirements of Phases 1 and 2 of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) Process (October 2000, as amended in 2007, 2011 and 2015), which is an approved process under the *Ontario Environmental Assessment Act*.

Public Information Centre

The PIC will be formatted as a drop-in style open house session with display materials summarizing transportation needs identified for North Grenville, recommended solutions, and public feedback received to date.
